Medical Students Host Future Physicians Fair for Valley High School Students at CHSU Medical School

CLOVIS, Calif. – Over 200 Central Valley High School students and parents have signed up for a Future Physicians Fair this Saturday, January 10th at the California Health Sciences University (CHSU) College of Osteopathic Medicine in Clovis.

Organized by medical students in the Valley Mentors student organization, this is the 2nd annual Future Physicians Fair offered to introduce local high school students and their parents to medicine in the medical school classrooms, labs, and simulation center environment.

"We invited local high school students and their parents from across Fresno, Clovis, Sanger, Madera, and Visalia to attend the Future Physicians Fair, with the hope that the experience will inspire the next generation of physicians here in the Central Valley," Akashdeep Gill, President of Valley Mentors and second-year medical student at CHSU.

The high school students and their parents will rotate through stations with interactive hands-on activities and demonstrations led by medical students, faculty physicians, and staff from the college and about 15 physicians from Kaiser Permanente in Fresno.

The stations include Intubation, Hand-held Ultrasound, Musculoskeletal overview, HoloAnatomy (Augmented Virtual Reality Anatomy), Taking Vitals, Suturing, Osteopathic Principles & Practice, Heart and Lungs overview, Overdose Prevention Committee, Medical School Admissions and Pathway programs overview.

The high school students were asked what they were excited to learn at the Future Physicians Fair during the registration process. One student replied, *"I would want to learn about different types of doctors and what they do and learn about the experience of being a doctor."*

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About California Health Sciences University

California Health Sciences University (CHSU) is accredited by the WASC Senior College and University Commission (WSCUC). CHSU is the first university of its kind in the Central Valley and offers a local option for medical school and a master's in biomedical sciences to help remedy the shortage of health care services offered in the Valley.

The CHSU College of Osteopathic Medicine (CHSU-COM) is accredited by the American Osteopathic Association's Commission on Osteopathic College Accreditation (COCA). CHSU-COM now has about 630 medical students in attendance. Both the classes of 2024 and 2025 achieved a 100% residency match rate. The CHSU medical school is accepting applications for its seventh cohort to matriculate in July 2026 ([link](#)).

CHSU also offers a one-year Master of Science in Biomedical Sciences (MSBS) program at its College of Biosciences and Health Professions. The first two cohorts of MSBS students graduated in 2024 and 2025 with about 60% now attending the CHSU College of Osteopathic Medicine. The CHSU master's program is accepting applications for its fourth cohort of MSBS students to matriculate in August 2026 ([link](#)).
