Job Description:	The Table Trainer faculty member is well versed and experienced in 1) Physical Examination skills and or 2) Osteopathic Manipulative Medicine (OMM) techniques. Responsibilities include observing and instruction medical students as they practice physical examination and/or OMM techniques on each other, during afternoon laboratory sessions.

Essential Duties:	<p>The following are a list of Academic Exercises that may be required as a faculty member of the Table Trainer faculty:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Serve as Physical Examination and/or OMM techniques’ instructor during laboratory sessions; • Prepare Physical Examination and/or OMM laboratory demonstrations as necessary, coordinating these educational tools with other faculty members; • Participate in practical examination grading by direct observation; • Aid in the evaluation of students’ mastery of the skills and information being taught and help to identify and remediate students that lack proficiency in these areas; • Attend faculty/team meetings to be prepared for the day’s lab; • Be able to take direction and receive assignments from Department Chairs and Course Directors; and • Accept other duties assigned/needed for the Institution’s needs. <p>This job description is not intended to be all inclusive and the employee will also perform other reasonably related duties as assigned by CHSU.</p>
