Job Description:

The role of the Chair of OPP includes assuring osteopathic philosophy, osteopathic principles, and the osteopathic tenets are taught broadly throughout the curriculum.

The chair functions as member of a collaborative teaching team, to develop and deliver instructional content within the CHSU COM curriculum.

Primary responsibilities will involve teaching osteopathic medical students the tenets, principles, and practices of osteopathic medicine including manipulative techniques. This function will occur primarily within the Osteopathic Principles and Practices courses of the 1st and 2nd academic years, as well as participating in the development of an integrated osteopathic curriculum for delivery in the 3rd and 4th academic years.

Service to the College and the community will also be an essential function of the position, including membership on the CHSU COM Leadership Team, faculty development, student advising, interviewing prospective students, and community outreach. Additionally, evidence of scholarly activity with a record of publication and productivity, are preferred and valued.
