- Plan for, develop and deliver curricular components of the Clinical TBL patient discussions.
- Develop Learning objectives for each session delivered
- Create pre-classroom assignments, such as narrated PowerPoints, case based materials and other readings
- Develop test questions and assessment tools that match the learning objectives
- Participate in Item Writing Workshops to develop test writing skills
- Participate in quality and improvement of the clinical educational programs to assure their effectiveness
- Collaborate to develop faculty development for all colleagues
- Participate in the training of Standardized patients
- Review video recording of Standardized Patient sessions
- Participate as needed, as an OPP table trainer under the guidance of the OPP Faculty and Chair
- Participate in COM committees such as Admissions, Awards, Curriculum, etc.
- Serve as an advisor for a cohort of medical students regardless of specialty
- Serve as a Faculty Chapter advisor for student interested groups/clubs
- Produce scholarly activities, especially related to learning outcomes
- Other duties to be assigned as necessary and may change to meet the COM's needs

This job description is not intended to be all inclusive and the employee will also perform other reasonably related duties as assigned by the Associate Dean for Osteopathic Clinical Education.
