The Osteopathic Principles and Practices (OPP) faculty in the College of Osteopathic Medicine (COM) assures osteopathic philosophy, osteopathic principles, and the osteopathic tenets are taught broadly throughout the curriculum. The primary responsibilities involve teaching osteopathic medical students the tenets, principles, and practices of osteopathic medicine. This occurs primarily within the OPP courses of the 1st and 2nd years, as well the development of an integrated osteopathic curriculum for delivery in the 3rd and 4th years.

- Approximately 80% time and effort devoted to delivering instruction in first and second year medical student curriculum and to providing service (committee responsibilities, student mentoring, interviewing, etc.). Additional time dedicated to 3rd and 4th year required elements. Work collaboratively with other faculty members to deliver and improve the integrated and interdisciplinary osteopathic medical curriculum in all 4 years. Work collaboratively with OPP student fellows to help grow a cadre of scholars.
- Approximately 20% time devoted to scholarly activity and optional clinical activity:
 - ◊ Participate in educational research activities.
 - ◊ Provide supervision of medical students and their scholarly projects.
