Job Description:	The Osteopathic Principles and Practices (OPP) faculty in the College of Osteopathic Medicine (COM) assures osteopathic philosophy, osteopathic principles, and the osteopathic tenets are taught broadly throughout the curriculum. The primary responsibilities involve teaching osteopathic medical students the tenets, principles, and practices of osteopathic medicine. This occurs primarily within the OPP courses of the first and second years, as well as the development of an integrated osteopathic curriculum for delivery in the third and fourth years.

Additional time is allotted to working with student organizations, osteopathic pre-doctoral scholars, and others. • Collaboration with other disciplines in a clinically integrated curriculum is necessary • Approximately 20 % time devoted to scholarly activity and optional clinical activity: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Participate in educational research activities. • Provide supervision of medical students and their scholarly projects. <p>This job description is not intended to be all inclusive and the employee will also perform other reasonably related duties as assigned by the OPP Chair.</p>
