

Job Title:	Osteopathic Principles and Practices Scholar
Job Description:	The Osteopathic Principles and Practices (OPP) Scholar in the College of Osteopathic Medicine (COM) assures osteopathic philosophy, osteopathic principles, and the osteopathic tenets are taught broadly throughout the curriculum. The primary responsibilities involve working alongside OPP Department faculty teaching osteopathic medical students the tenets, principles, and practices of osteopathic medicine. This occurs primarily within the OPP courses of the 1 st and 2 nd years, as well as the development of an integrated osteopathic curriculum for delivery in the 3 rd and 4 th years.

Essential Duties:	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Teaching: The primary teaching responsibilities will be as a table trainer, assessor, and mentor during all four (4) years of the curriculum, as appropriate. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ The Scholar will be required to present one didactic and one lab to an OMS class over the course of the 12 months of service. The student is eligible to lead more if the interest and skill is present. ○ Additional time dedicated to 3rd and 4th year required elements. ○ Work collaboratively with other faculty members to deliver and improve the integrated and interdisciplinary osteopathic medical curriculum in all four (4) years. ○ Work collaboratively with others to help grow a cadre of osteopathic scholars. • Service: To work with the student organizations (particularly the SAAO), the OPP Table Assistants, and provide student mentoring in years 1-4 as appropriate, assist with student interviews, act a liaison for the school and OPP department as needed, projects as otherwise assigned. • Scholarship: Time devoted to scholarly activity(including curriculum and assessment design and delivery) and optional clinical activity: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Participate in educational and other possible research activities. ○ Provide supervision of medical students and their scholarly projects. ○ Other duties as assigned.
