

Job Title:**Assistant Professor, Specialty Medicine, College of Osteopathic Medicine****Job Description:**

The Specialty Medicine clinical faculty member will have a vision of the skills, expertise, and knowledge needed by the osteopathic physician of the future, as well as the curriculum needed to provide these outcomes. This position participates and assists the Department Chair and colleagues in the planning, directing, and implementation of college programs, policies, and procedures, and assists in the development and teaching of curricula that integrate the different specialty areas in team-based, large, and small group learning environments.

Specialty Medicine faculty positions are varied and include clinical faculty positions that do not fit within the defined Primary Care faculty roles. Specialty Medicine faculty positions include but are not limited to the following areas of specialty:

- Emergency Medicine
- Radiology and Medical Imaging
- General Surgery and Surgical subspecialties including Anesthesiology, Urology, Orthopedic surgery, etc.
- Internal Medicine subspecialties including Hematology/Oncology, Nephrology, Infectious disease, etc.
- Physical Medicine and Rehabilitation
- Neurology
- Psychiatry

Essential Duties:

The essential functions (i.e., the fundamental job duties of the position) are as follows:

- Serve as a course director or co-course director.
- Plan for, develop, and deliver curricular components of the first and/or second-year clinical curriculum, including patient discussions.
- Create pre-classroom assignments, such as narrated PowerPoints, case-based materials, and other readings
- Develop test questions and develop and grade other assessment tool items under the guidance of others.
- Participate in the continuous quality improvement of the clinical educational programs to ensure their accuracy and effectiveness
- Collaborate to develop faculty development for all colleagues
- Participate as needed as an OPP table trainer under the guidance of the OPP Faculty and Chair.
- Participate in COM committees such as Admissions, Awards, Curriculum, etc.
- Serve as an advisor for a cohort of medical students regardless of specialty.
- Participate in student interviews
- Produce scholarly activities and represent the school at professional events.
- Clinical practice as per university, if indicated.
- Other duties to be assigned as necessary and may change to meet the COM's needs
- In executing job duties, faculty members must abide by all CHSU and College of Osteopathic Medicine policies, procedures, and syllabi requirements. This job description is not intended to be all-inclusive, and the faculty member will also
